

Research Methodology	Once set on a research design, many struggles to choose the appropriate study methods. Null/alternative hypothesis, sampling techniques, research protocol, data collection methods, ethical considerations... You might wonder what we're talking about, join this session and guarantee you'll get the hang of it all.			
Data Collection, Analysis and statistics	This session will make you the MASTER of data collection. Once your data is collected, interpreting it and visualizing your results and conclusions can be quite tricky. But don't worry, this session is all about analysis and statistics. You will learn about different statistical tests, how to run them and what statistical programs or software to use. We will help you understand the limitations of each and appraise statistical significance in analysis.

Join this session and learn how to identify different potential biases when choosing the right sample and the right methodology. We will be discussing research bias implications and how to successfully avoid or minimize them.

Scientific Inquiry	What's the difference between a scientist and a normal person? well, it's his ability to ask a pertinent question. That's what this session is all about. Let's take a look at the steps needed to elaborate a well structured question and turn it into a research project.			
Literature review	The most efficient way to gather information is through taking a look at literature, but it can sometimes get a little complicated. Let's break it down and turn literature review from a chore to a fun activity!			
Critical appraisal, peer-review, and EBM	One must know the difference between a reliable information and a biased one. In addition, in the era of exponential knowledge growth, it's become mandatory to base our practice on accurate and precise facts: There is no more room for speculations. Take a deep look at evidence-based medicine, and critical appraisal. The cost of finding too much information is the same as the cost of finding a little, that is why one of the session objectives is to guide physicians to conduct an effective literature search for the best clinical evidence in a time-efficient manner.			
Physician Hub: Ease your Way to the Library Everyday	Living in the technological era, much innovative software has been developed to serve rapid progress. As medical students and potential researchers, we should stay informed of the various tools assisting research.

Study designs	Finding a hard time choosing the appropriate study design for your research question? Join us and learn about different research study designs, how to apply them and how to identify them.			
Research in Conflict Zones: Towards a re-Evaluation of ethics	Researchers doing research in conflict zones, more often than not, face new and frustrating situations as well as ethical conundrums that are different than those faced by their colleagues working in regular research settings. The talk will highlight the essentials of research ethics and some challenges and dilemmas surrounding research ethics in war zones shedding light on the need to use practical wisdom (phronesis) when making decisions. The case of the Gaza strip on OPT will be used as a model.			
Safeguards and integrity in research	The principles of ethical commitment are translated into certain safeguards which ensure that these commitments are applied. In this session, we will delve into the concepts of informed consent, independent review, transparency, Institutional Review Board, and conflicts of interest. We will also explore the mechanisms and the responsibility which lies with reporting scientific errors and avoiding plagiarism.
